Activity completed: Construction of a classroom "frame".



IPSWICH SCHOOL (14 girls, 2 adult males, 1 female teacher)

Arrival on 19 July, pegging of the foundation for the building and digging of foundation.



Visitation by the local chief and administrator.



Making frames for the concrete pillars of the building structure.



Ferrying of stones and sand for filling in the foundation. Filling in of foundation with stones and concrete.



Sawing and preparing shattering timber for pillars.

SAMUEL WARD SCHOOL (1 girl, 8 boys, 1 female adult, 1 male adult)



Arrival on 27 July towards noon. Laying stones for foundation.

Breaking large stones into smaller one to lay on the foundation and fill in the box.

Helping to plant cabbages in the garden down by the river.

Arrival on 01 August and putting together timber for roofing trusses.
